Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Kannada Balag Society's Rural Ayurveda Medical College, Auto Nagar, Main Double Road, Tq & Distt. Belgaum-590016, Karnataka (Inst. Id- AYU0082) with 38 seats [instead of 40 seats] in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Kannada Balag Society's Rural Ayurveda Medical College, Auto Nagar, Main Double Road, Tq & Distt. Belgaum-590016, Karnataka (Inst. Id- AYU0082)**, inspection of your College was conducted on **17.03.2025 & 18.03.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process the **Yearly Permission with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation port, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

I. Teaching staffs:-

a) For UG Course:-

Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part-1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{21}{30} \times 100\% = 70.00\%$ (Excluding Excess)

II. Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments availability is 98.52%.

3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **135th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **18.07.2025**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above an opportunity was given to your college to submit the clarification for the same vide the Boards letter (clarification letter) of **even number** dated **26.07.2025**. In response of the same the college submitted clarification **vide letter no. KBSRAM/2025-26/GEN/011 dated 28.07.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
4. The shortcomings communicated to the college, and the submissions made are as under:-

For UG Course:-

1.	Ayurved Samhita Siddhant	1HF	The college appointed Dr. Shahataj Humanabad (Associate AYSS01198). Therefore, the faculty can be considered.
2.	Rachana Sharir	1HF	There is a deficiency of a Higher Faculty. The college affirmed that they are in talks with several teachers who have shown a keen interest and will be appointing soon. Therefore, shortcoming persists.
3.	Kriya Sharir	1LF	There is a deficiency of a Lower Faculty. The college affirmed that they are in talks with several teachers who have shown a keen interest and will be appointing soon. Therefore, shortcoming persists.
4.	Shalakya Tantra	1HF & 1LF	1LF - In the Shalakya Department college has appointed Dr. Komal (Assistant Professor: AYSK01449) and Dr. Navnath Teli who was present at the time of Visitation and he was verified by the visitors. Therefore, both the faculties can be considered.
5.	Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan	1HF	There is a deficiency of a Lower Faculty. The college affirmed that they are in talks with several teachers who have shown a keen interest and will be appointing soon. Therefore, shortcoming persists.
6.	Kaumarbhritya BalaRoga	1HF	The college appointed Dr. Pravin Patil (Associate Professor: AYKB00536) due to issues in his OTMS portal which was notified to NCISM, he is not yet relieved from his previous institute, and his previous college has been closed and they are not responding to the college. Therefore, shortcoming persists.
7.	Kayachikitsa	02HF	The college appointed Dr. Raghavendra Y (Professor: AYKC01745), he is also linked to institute's OTMS portal before visitation but were unable to link him in the Part-I performa. He was also present during visitation. Therefore, the faculty can be considered. We have appointed Dr. Supriya Bodake (Associate Professor AYKC00049) was appointed before visitation however due to issues in her OTMS portal she is not yet relieved from her previous institute which was notified to NCISM, her application has been in stuck with technical officer in the previous institute the college will link her profile to the institute's OTMS portal as soon as the issues are resolved. She was also present during visitation. Therefore, the faculty can be considered.

			<p>Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the clarification submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{30} \times 100\% = 86.66\%$ (Excluding Excess)</p> <p>Mean of general and essential equipment's and instruments availability was 98.52%. The college clarified that it has more than adequate equipment and instruments as per the MSR-2016 and is also upgrading existing equipments and making improvements for upcoming years.</p>
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5. The submission made by the college and assessment report have been carefully re-examined in terms of in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under, **and once again**, submission made by the college and assessment report was placed in the **138th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **on 01.08.2025**.

6. In view of the above, submission made by the college, and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the Board observed that the college **is not fulfilling the approved and requisite criteria for issuance of Yearly permission for 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2025-26. However, the Board decided to issue Permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy approved by in 122nd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 14.05.2025 in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26, wherein it is mentioned that:-**

a) "For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly, as per **Board's policy letter for assessment of Ayurveda colleges issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025** "The 10% Relaxation in the requirement of the teaching staff may be extended for the Academic year 2025-26. Therefore, the colleges with 60 and 100 intake capacity shall have minimum of 27 and 40 teaching staff respectively fulfilling the requirements of the individual departments separately"

Accordingly, there is deficiency of 01 teachers for issuance of Yearly Permission for academic session 2025-26 under **Section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-2026, for deficiency of four teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity.**

7. Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, the college **is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Yearly permission with 38 seats [instead of 40 seats] in UG (BAMS) course as per regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.**

"DECISION"

8. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Kannada Balag Society's Rural Ayurveda Medical College, Auto Nagar, Main Double Road, Tq & Distt. Belgaum-590016, Karnataka (Inst. Id- AYU0082) is hereby granted with:-**

a) **Yearly permission with seat reduction policy in UG (BAMS) course with 38 seats [instead of 40 seats] in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024;**

9. The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-

(i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 38 seats UG [instead of 40 seats]** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

10. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

11. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

12. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

13. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**

14. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2025 as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR UG 2024 and Regulation 15(9)(b) of MESAR PG 2024 compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2026-2027:**

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
- iv) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- v) The compliance of shortcoming mentioned in para- 06.

15. In case if you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the letter as per Regulation 65 of MESAR 2024 and Regulation 29(5) of NCISM Act 2020.

16. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
